It is officially back-to-school season, which means Chicago Commons is gearing up for another school year filled with discovery, growth, and development for our children. As the summer winds down, we have seen a lot of excitement already at our early education centers in support of our children and families. This month, Mayor Lori Lightfoot visited our Nia Family Center in Humboldt Park and read a book by Toni Morrison to our kids. The Mayor created a special moment for our children to see and hear the words of two important African American women whose work and legacy displays a commitment to community, equity, and representation. The reading session was followed by a press conference where Mayor Lightfoot promoted enrollment into high-quality early learning preschools, and discussed the City's budget, which includes a **\$42 million dollar investment** for community-based early education partners. We are excited about what these investments mean for improving the quality and access to pre-K programs in Chicago.




In addition to the mayor's visit, Chicago Commons has felt the love and support from community stakeholders for our early education centers. With the help of our friends at **PNC Bank, the Chicago Bears**, Alderman Walter Burnett Jr. and the State of Illinois, we started a playground rebuild at Nia Family Center this month. We are thrilled about this project that will provide our children with a great new space for learning, playing, and exploring. These investments will not only improve the educational experiences and opportunities for our kids, but will also help uplift entire communities.

The support of community stakeholders and individual supporters has enabled Chicago Commons to continue to have a positive impact in our communities. But we also have a deep and long history in Chicago, which was featured this month WBEZ's "What's That Building". The segment explored the building that was once Chicago Commons' settlement house located on Grand and Morgan, built in 1901. Revisiting our history through the significance of this building that is now home to Bennett Day School, it serves as a physical marker how the City has changed over time, and how Chicago Commons has adapted to meet the needs of the people.

After 125 years, our mission today is to empower individuals, families, and communities to overcome poverty and systemic barriers, embrace opportunities, and thrive across generations. We want to celebrate our past and share our future

On Friday, August 9, Mayor Lori Lightfoot visited Chicago Commons' Nia Family Center in Humboldt Park. Joined by [Alderman Walter Burnett Jr.](#) and representatives of the [Chicago Department of Family and Support Services](#) and [Chicago Public Schools](#), Mayor Lightfoot encouraged parents and guardians to enroll their children in early education programs. This year, the city will increase its investment in early learning programs by **\$76 million** to provide all families, regardless of zip code, with options for high-quality early education.

Thank you Mayor Lightfoot for your visit to Chicago Commons and for your investment in early education programs based on quality, equity, and community need. These investments will set children on the right path towards kindergarten readiness and lifelong success.

On Thursday, August 1, Chicago Commons was featured on [WBEZ Morning Shift's "What's that Building?"](#) segment. They explored what was once Chicago Commons' settlement house located on Grand and Morgan, built in 1901. That building is now home to the [Bennett Day School](#), a private school that is coincidentally one of a handful of local schools along with Chicago Commons that offers the Reggio Emilia approach to learning.

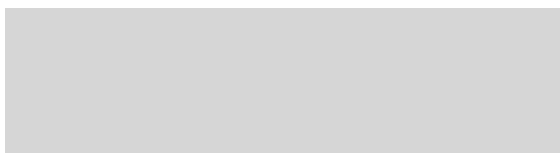
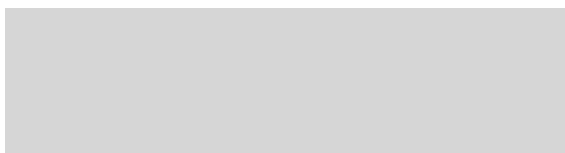
