# Father's Day Celebration at Early Ed Centers



Jesus shared the successes of our Reggio Emilia approach to learning, which Commons adopts at all four of our early education centers. The conference and tour were designed for seasoned thought leaders on the adaptation of the Reggio Emilia approach in the United States. In total, 200 educators from around the United States attended, several of which have been exploring the Reggio Emilia approach for decades. We are proud of Jesus' accomplishments and his work to ensure our schools provide high-quality learning environments that allow children to explore and grow socially, emotionally, and
