The overwhelming support we are receiving from from many of you during the COVID-19 pandemic is helping us respond quickly to meet the needs of our families - we are so thankful for your generosity.

The health and well-being of the children, families, seniors, and staff at Chicago Commons remains our top priority. The Chicago Commons team is rising to the challenge and going above and beyond to bring care and support to our families. **Donations to our COVID-19 Relief Fund** are contributing directly to the health, security, and well-being of our seniors, families, and staff.

Our **Home Care program** continues to assist vulnerable seniors across the Chicago metropolitan region. This week, thanks to generous donations from the **Illinois Department on Aging** and Chicago Commons' Director of Corporate and Foundation Relations Mary Penn, we secured personal protective equipment (PPE) for our home care aides to keep them and our seniors safe during visits. With funds from the **COVID-19 Relief Fund**, senior care also purchased 20 gallons of hand sanitizer from Koval Distillery who switched their production from spirits to hand sanitizer for front-line healthcare workers. We are also securing more PPE with support from our donors.

Our Adult Day Services (ADS) team remains devoted to providing participants with love and care while our ADS center programming remains temporarily suspended. On Friday, April 3, 2020, the ADS team picked up groceries from Touch Gift Foundation to deliver to our participants who live alone and have families in need. ADS Director Delizza Russell shared, "The look of surprise, gratitude, appreciation and hope expressed by the participants and their families warmed our hearts." Thank you to our ADS team for continuing to provide assistance during these uncertain times and caring for our seniors in the community.
